- Planning and Development Board: The Board will hold a public hearing on Monday, February 1<sup>st</sup> at 7:30 p.m. in Room 205. Items on the agenda are as follows: recommendation from the Commission on Disability for the reprogramming of \$99,000 in CDBG funds to the Newton Highlands Playground and \$20,800 in CDBG funds towards the purchase of audible pedestrian signal (APS) units; request by Citizens for Affodable Housing in Newton (CAN-DO) for an additional \$75,000 in CDBG and HOME funds for the rehabilitation of an existing two-family house located at 10-12 Cambria Road; and approval of minutes from January 4, 2016. - Land Use Committee: The Committee will meet on Tuesday, February 2<sup>nd</sup> in the City Council Chambers (Room 207) on the following petitions: #480-14(4), petition for Special Permit to change one nonconforming use to another by restoring and expanding an existing structure know as the Turtle Lane Playhouse with office space above, to provide a mixed-use building with an addition containing 4 dwelling units at street level and above and a second building containing a 16-unit multi-family dweling with a below-grade parking garage for 27 cars at 283 Melrose Street; Jointly with the Finance Committee, #356-15, request for Community Preservation Act funding for two units of permanently affordable rental housing at 10-12 Cambria Road in which the Community Preservation Committee has recommended the appropriation of \$471,117 from the fund for a grant to Citizens for Affordable Housing.
