- **Finance Committee** – The committee will be meeting on **Monday, May 9th at 7:00p.m.** in Room 211 to review the *ASSESSING; TREASURER; PURCHASING and EXECUTIVE/SUSTAINABILITY* Department budgets. FY17 Budget

FY17 Budget Resolutions – If there are resolutions you are considering for the Committee of the Whole budget deliberations, please try to submit them to the Clerk’s Office as soon as you can. This way, Council members will be able to get an understanding of what is being proposed and it will give the departments and the Executive Office time to prepare and respond to us in a timely fashion. *Resolutions are subject to an affirmative majority vote of the Committee of the Whole* but understanding what is being proposed ahead of time gives colleagues a chance to discuss ideas with each other. Additionally, it will help the Clerk’s Office with their work as they are incredibly swamped over these next few weeks. Thanks in advance for your cooperation.

- **FY17 Budget Analysis and DRAFT Budget Council Order** – In your packet you will find a detailed analysis on the FY17 budget created by Comptroller David Wilkinson. David creates this each year for the Council and it is a tremendous document. Please take a few minutes to review it and I’m sure it will answer many questions you may have. **Great job David!** It can also be found at this link: <http://www.newtonma.gov/civicax/filebank/documents/74996>. In the online packet you will also find a DRAFT of the FY17 budget Council Order. This is the actual document the Council passes. - **Committee of the Whole Procedures for the Review of Departmental Budgets** (*this information was originally supplied by Finance Chairman Gentile in our March 18th packet and remains in the online packet*):

Monday, May 16th – Following Council First Call (Council meeting will begin at 7:00p.m.) – Committee of the Whole Budget Deliberations – Dinner will be provided at 6:00p.m.

- Committee Chairmen or Vice Chairmen will give brief reports on their department budgets, along with the Committee’s straw vote recommendation and any resolutions acted upon by the Committee. Our deliberation will be conducted by starting at the beginning of the budget book and reviewing each budget in the order they appear in the book
- Resolutions to the budget and CIP will be in order at any time until a final vote is taken on the budget. Resolutions with an affirmative majority vote of the COTW will be sent along to the Mayor for response. Due to the tight timeframe, again it would be appreciated if resolutions were submitted through the Clerk’s Office in advance of our deliberations. This way, members can understand what is being proposed and ask questions. We can then vote on these in COTW on May 16th or May 18th to insure the Mayor can respond by our meeting on May 19th.

Wednesday, May 18th – 7:00 pm – Committee of the Whole Budget Deliberations:

- Any responses from the Mayor to the resolutions approved by the Board on the 18th will be presented. Committee Chairmen or Vice Chairmen who did not have the opportunity to report their department budgets on the 18th will provide those reports.
- Resolutions to the budget are in order at any time until a final vote is taken on the budget. Resolutions with an affirmative majority vote of the COTW will be sent along to the Mayor who will provide a response by our meeting on May 19th.

Thursday, May 19th – 7:00 pm – Committee of the Whole Budget Deliberations and Anticipated Final Vote on the Budget.

- Any responses to the resolutions approved by the Board on the 20th will be presented. Once the budget is passed by a majority vote of the COTW, we will adjourn the COTW and enter into the full Board. Once in the full Board, the Chairman of Finance will report out the actions of the COTW.
- The full Board will then discuss (if needed) and vote the FY17 Budget. The date of the final vote of the Board will depend upon our deliberations and when the Mayor responds to any resolutions. As mentioned, this date is anticipated to be Thursday, May 19th but if not, it must happen by June 3, 2016.
