#112-17 Appropriate \$185,000 to supplement the Highlands Playground Project budget

HIS HONOR THE MAYOR requesting authorization to appropriate and expend one hundred eighty-five thousand dollars (\$185,000) from Overlay Surplus for the purpose of covering construction administration and contingency costs associated with the Newton Highlands Playground renovation project. **Note:** The Chair noted that the Finance Committee approved this funding at their April 24<sup>th</sup> meeting.

Bob DeRubeis, Commissioner of Parks & Recreation explained that the Highlands Playground project costs were about \$3M with \$2.5M coming from Community Preservation funds, and \$100K from ADA funding. The requested funds will provide \$65,000 for construction administration. Weston and Sampson has had their Construction Administrator out to the site a number of times, as the contractor has had a number of questions on the project so the Commissioner felt there was great value in having that in place. The remaining funds in the request will provide a contingency fund. All of the previous Community Preservation funding for the project was allocated to construction due to the cost of the project and there was never a contingency for the project. Commissioner DeRubeis explained that there will be a funding request for the building on the site once the park is complete. All of the utilities work will be done as part of the construction project and then a pre-fab fieldhouse will be dropped onto the site.

Councilor Kalis moved approval and the Committee voted in favor unanimously.
