- Local Historic Districts: On Monday, June 12<sup>th</sup> the Zoning and Planning Committee and the Planning and Development Board will host a public hearing to discuss the recommendation from the Newton Historical Commission to establish a West Newton Local Historic District. A draft Study Report for a proposed Local Historic District (LHD) in West Newton was written by an ad hoc group of West Newton residents and will be presented at the public hearing. The proposed historic district was identified in order to preserve the architectural and historical core of West Newton from demolition and to ensure that new development in the proposed district is in keeping with its architectural and historical integrity. Both the Newton Historical Commission and the Masshachusetts Historical Commission approved the draft report as meeting the requirements of the state enabling legislation known as Chapter 40C was introduced. The proposed Newton Highlands Local Historic District presented a draft Study Report to the Zoning and Planning Committee and the
